

# Museum of Fire COVID Safe Plan

The Museum of Fire is committed to creating a safe environment for all staff, volunteers, and visitors and, as such, this COVID Safe plan must be adhered to. The Museum follows the NSW Public Health Orders and restrictions and FRNSW's COVID Safe Plan.

As of <u>23 November 2022</u>, the following policies and practices must be adhered to gain entry into the Museum or access to Museum grounds:

- All museum staff and volunteers must be vaccinated.
  - Staff/volunteers who refuse to show proof or are not double vaccinated will not be permitted to continue to work/volunteer at the Museum and will be asked to leave the grounds.
  - o Staff, volunteers and contractors will need to fill out the on-site form.
- Masks are not mandatory, but encouraged for indoor settings where staff cannot maintain a safe distance from others and to protect vulnerable people who may have access to the Museum.
- Staff members and volunteers who feel unwell, have COVID-19 symptoms, or test positive for COVID-19 should not come to work.
  - o If you feel unwell, have COVID-19 symptoms, or test positive for COVID-19, you should stay home and contact the Museum by phone or email.
  - Protect your colleagues and the community by following NSW Health's recommendations on <u>Testing positive to COVID-19 and managing COVID-19 safely</u> at home.

### Fire Engine Rides can be undertaken again.

#### Action being undertaken by the Museum to reduce the risk to staff, volunteers and visitors

- All staff and volunteers will be required to be fully vaccinated.
- Contractors working on the tower or in the grounds do not need to be vaccinated however they will need to follow the policy of their employer.
- Regular and increased cleaning and disinfecting of all surfaces in accordance with the Safe Work Australia guidelines and the Public Health Authority.
- Please note that as a staff/volunteer member of the Museum of Fire Community when you sign the attendance book you are declaring you are fit to work and have not:
  - o Got any symptoms of flu, cold or other illness

#### **Vulnerable Workers**

At present the following are deemed "vulnerable workers"

- People over 70 years of age
- People over 65 years of age who have chronic health conditions
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders
